SENATE BILL NO. 1060, As Amended

BY EDUCATION COMMITTEE

AN ACT

1 RELATING TO EDUCATION; AMENDING TITLE 33, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A  
2 NEW CHAPTER 61, TITLE 33, IDAHO CODE, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO ESTABLISH PRO-  
3 VISIONS REGARDING FLEXIBLE SCHEDULES FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS, TO PROVIDE  
4 FOR CERTAIN FUNDING AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS WITH FLEXIBLE SCHEDULES, TO  
5 ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING EARLY GRADUATION, TO PROVIDE FOR CER-  
6 TAIN FUNDING AVAILABLE TO EARLY GRADUATES AND THEIR HIGH SCHOOLS, AND TO  
7 PROVIDE DUTIES OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

10 SECTION 1. That Title 33, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended  
11 by the addition thereto of a NEW CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chap-  
12 ter 61, Title 33, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

13 CHAPTER 61

14 OPPORTUNITIES FOR COLLEGE AND CAREER READY STUDENTS

15 33-6101. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

16 (1) "Board" means the state board of education.

17 (2) "College and career readiness score" means the minimum score on  
18 a college entrance examination indicating that a student is academically  
19 ready to advance to an institution of higher education or to an occupation or  
20 occupational training, as determined by the board.

21 (3) "College entrance examination" means the ACT, the SAT, or a similar  
22 examination identified by the board.

23 33-6102. FLEXIBLE SCHEDULE. (1) A student is eligible to take a flexi-  
24 ble schedule as provided in subsection (2) of this section if the student:

25 (a) Is at least sixteen (16) years of age;

26 (b) Maintains a cumulative 3.5 grade point average;

27 (c) Obtains permission from a parent or guardian, if under the age of  
28 eighteen (18) years;

29 (d) Files notification with the student's school, including an essay of  
30 at least one (1) page explaining why the student wishes to have a flexi-  
31 ble schedule; and

32 (e) Achieves a college and career readiness score.

33 (2) An eligible student may, at the student's option and upon notifica-  
34 tion to the student's school, be relieved from completing any remaining high  
35 school graduation requirements. Such student shall have flexibility in the  
36 student's schedule to:

37 (a) Take elective courses, career technical education programs, or  
38 core courses as selected by the student and determined to be available  
39 by the student's school district or public charter school;

40 (b) Participate in apprenticeships or internships;

- 1 (c) Act as a tutor at any grade level; or  
2 (d) Engage in such other activities as identified by the board.

3 33-6103. FLEXIBLE SCHEDULE -- ADVANCED OPPORTUNITIES FUNDING. A stu-  
4 dent who opts for a flexible schedule pursuant to the provisions of section  
5 33-6102, Idaho Code, may use the student's allotment of advanced opportuni-  
6 ties funds for activities identified in subsection (2) of that section.

7 33-6104. EARLY GRADUATION. (1) A student is eligible to graduate early  
8 as provided in subsection (2) of this section if the student:

- 9 (a) Is at least sixteen (16) years of age;  
10 (b) Maintains a cumulative 3.5 grade point average;  
11 (c) Obtains permission from a parent or guardian, if under the age of  
12 eighteen (18) years;  
13 (d) Achieves a college and career readiness score;  
14 (e) Files notification with the student's school, including an essay  
15 of at least one (1) page explaining why the student wishes to graduate  
16 early; and  
17 (f) Completes:  
18 (i) The civics test required by section 33-1602, Idaho Code; and  
19 (ii) The economics credit, government credits, and senior project  
20 required under the board's graduation requirements, provided that  
21 the student's senior project may describe the student's experi-  
22 ence in achieving a college and career readiness score and include  
23 a detailed explanation of the student's future plans.

24 (2) An eligible student may, at the student's option and upon notifica-  
25 tion to the student's school, be relieved from completing any remaining high  
26 school graduation requirements and graduate early.

27 (3) School districts or public charter schools must grant high school  
28 diplomas to students who are eligible and opt for early graduation pursuant  
29 to this section.

30 33-6105. FUNDING AVAILABLE TO EARLY GRADUATES AND SCHOOLS. If a person  
31 graduates early under the provisions of this chapter:

32 (1) Funding in an amount equivalent to a portion of the annual aver-  
33 age for student funding allocated by the state that would have been used to  
34 educate the person shall, according to such parameters established by the  
35 board, be distributed to an Idaho public postsecondary institution where the  
36 person is pursuing higher education or occupational education or training,  
37 to pay for tuition, fees, textbooks, or other expenses associated with such  
38 education or training. A person for whom funding is made available pursuant  
39 to this subsection shall not be eligible for the advanced opportunities  
40 scholarship described in section 33-4602, Idaho Code. Funding pursuant to  
41 this subsection shall be provided for each academic year or half-year that  
42 the person would have attended high school but for graduating early, as fol-  
43 lows:

- 44 (a) For an academic year, sixty-five percent (65%) of the annual aver-  
45 age for student funding shall be made available to further the person's  
46 education or training as provided in this subsection. The person must

1 graduate prior to the start of the academic year for which funding under  
2 this subsection is made available; and

3 (b) For a half-year, thirty-two and one-half percent (32.5%) of the an-  
4 nual average for student funding shall be made available to further the  
5 person's education or training as provided in this subsection. The per-  
6 son must graduate prior to the start of the half of the academic year for  
7 which funding under this paragraph is made available; and

8 (2) Funding in an amount equivalent to thirty-five percent (35%) of the  
9 annual average for student funding allocated by the state that would have  
10 been used to educate such person shall be allocated to the school from which  
11 the person graduated.

12 33-6106. DUTIES OF BOARD. The board shall:

13 (1) Perform duties specifically provided in this chapter; and

14 (2) Take such actions as are necessary to implement and enforce the pro-  
15 visions of this chapter, including the promulgation of any necessary rules.
