Chairman Palmer called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

Committee Page, Claire Walker was recognized for her service. She received a

gift from the committee of a handmade commemorative quilt.

RS 28000: Chairman Palmer made a unanimous consent request to move RS 28000 to the

top of the agenda. There being no objection, the request was granted.

Chairman Palmer presented **RS 28000**. This concurrent resolution approves and extends Administrative Rules reviewed by the House Transportation and Defense

Committee and Senate Transportation Committee.

MOTION: Rep. Holtzclaw made a motion to introduce RS 28000 and recommend it be sent

directly to the Second Reading Calendar. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep.

Palmer will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 325aaS: H 325aaS was brought before the committee again by Rep. Palmer, for

consideration of the Senate amendments.

MOTION: Rep. Harris made a motion to Concur with the amendments made in the Senate to

H 325aaS. Motion carried by voice vote. Reps. Rubel and Gannon requested to

be recorded as voting NAY. Rep. Palmer will sponsor the bill on the floor.

Chairman Palmer turned the gavel over to Vice Chairman Shepherd.

H 614: Chairman Palmer presented H 614, which was carried over from the meeting of

March 12, 2020, due to time constraints. This legislation addresses safety concerns associated with a significant portion of distracted driving crashes. Enforcement and conditions under which electronic device communications would be allowed are defined. The problem of having a growing patchwork of local distracted driving

ordinances is addressed.

MOTION: Rep. DeMordaunt made a motion to send H 614 to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation.

Reps. DeMordaunt and **Youngblood** spoke **in support** of the motion.

VOTE ON MOTION:

Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Palmer will sponsor the bill on the floor.

Vice Chairman Shepherd turned the gavel over to Chairman Palmer.

S 1297: Rep. McCrostie presented S 1297, which was carried over from the meeting of March 12, 2020, due to time constraints. This bill creates a "Too Great For Hate" specialty license plate. Senator Cherie Buckner-Webb spoke in support of S 1297. She said funds generated by the sale of the license plate will be directed to the Wassmuth Center for Human Rights, Anne Frank Memorial in Boise, Idaho. MOTION: Rep. Rubel made a motion to send S 1297 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Dan Prinzing and Don Murray, representing the Wassmuth Center, spoke in support of the bill. VOTE ON Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. McCrostie will sponsor the bill on the floor. MOTION: S 1349: Rep. Syme presented H 1349, which was carried over from the meeting of March 12, 2020, due to time constraints. After July 1, 2020, any special license plate program that has a nonprofit agency as a recipient of the proceeds will be required to meet a quota of plates sold. No new special license plate or special license plate program shall be established for the benefit of any entity other than the State of Idaho or an agency of the State of Idaho. ORIGINAL Rep. Blanksma made a motion to send S 1349 to the floor with a DO PASS MOTION: recommendation. **Rep. Wintrow** spoke in opposition to the motion. SUBSTITUTE Rep. Kauffman made a substitute motion to HOLD S 1349 in committee. MOTION: ROLL CALL Chairman Palmer stated he was in doubt regarding the voice vote. Roll call vote VOTE: was requested. Motion failed by a vote of 7 AYE, 9 NAY, 2 ABSENT/EXCUSED. Voting in favor of the motion: Reps. Shepherd, Gestrin, Kauffman, Youngblood, Wintrow, Gannon, Davis. Voting in opposition to the motion: Reps. Palmer, Dixon, Harris, Holtzclaw, DeMordaunt, Syme, Blanksma, Addis, Ricks. Absent/excused: Reps. Monks, Davis. VOTE ON Chairman Palmer called for a vote on the original motion to sent S 1349 to the **ORIGINAL** floor with a DO PASS recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. MOTION: **Syme** will sponsor the bill on the floor. S 1379aa: Jason Kreizenbeck, Idaho Trucking Association, presented S 1379aa. This bill

Jason Kreizenbeck, Idaho Trucking Association, presented S 1379aa. This bill provides a method for using existing law enforcement and Idaho Transportation Department resources to inspect commercial vehicles for dyed fuel. The legislation

also defines and sets violations and civil penalties for violations.

MOTION: Rep. Kauffman made a motion to send S 1379aa to the floor with a DO PASS

recommendation. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Kauffman will sponsor

the bill on the floor.

MOTION: Rep. Gannon made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 12, 2020,

meeting. Motion carried by voice vote.
