2	RELATING TO HUMAN RIGHTS; AMENDING CHAPTER 59, TITLE 67, IDAHO CODE, BY THE
3	ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 67-5909B, IDAHO CODE, TO PROHIBIT DENIAL OF
4	ACCESS TO APPROPRIATE MEDICAL SERVICES UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES AND
5	TO DEFINE A TERM; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho: 6

SECTION 1. That Chapter 59, Title 67, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW SECTION, to be known and des-9 ignated as Section 67-5909B, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

67-5909B. DENIAL OF ACCESS TO MEDICAL SERVICES -- CORONAVIRUS. (1) No health care provider, hospital, or medical care facility shall deny a person medical services appropriate for the person's condition, disease, or injury on the basis of such person's:

- (a) Infection with coronavirus;
- (b) Immunization status for coronavirus; or
- (c) Refusal to receive a vaccination, take a specific medication, or receive a specific treatment for coronavirus.
- (2) For purposes of this section, "coronavirus" means:
- (a) Severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2;
- The disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2; or
- (c) Any subsequently identified mutation, modification, or strain of coronavirus if the transmission of said virus among humans rises to the level of an epidemic or pandemic and qualifies for an emergency declaration under applicable Idaho law.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.
