SENATE AMENDMENT TO H 583 AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1

On page 2 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 8, and insert: "A person, including a full-time student who has established a domicile in Idaho may declare residency earlier than ninety (90) days for vehicle registration, titling, driver's license and identification card purposes. However, any driver's license or identification card issued to a person who has been domiciled in Idaho for less than thirty (30) days may not be used for identification for the purpose of voting. The department may title or register a vehicle to a person who has an Idaho driver's license or identification card and has been domiciled in Idaho for less than thirty (30) days. Establishment of residency shall include a spouse and dependent".

SENATE AMENDMENT TO H 572 AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 14 through 17, and insert: "gram" means a plan funded or administered by the government under which an individual is provided with regular, unconditional cash payments to be used for any purpose by the individual. (a) <u>A drug that is subject to restricted distribution by the</u> United States food and drug administration; or

(b) A drug that requires special handling, provider coordination, or patient education that a retail pharmacy cannot provide."; and in line 43, delete "(12)" and insert: "(13)".

On page 8, in line 35, following "fraud" insert: ", waste, or abuse"; in line 38, delete "due" and insert: "solely due"; and following line 46, insert:

"(15) In complying with the requirements of this section, a pharmacy benefit manager or its agents, and the director or the director's agents, shall not directly or indirectly publish or otherwise disclose any information reported to the director under this section that would reveal: the identity of a specific pharmacy benefits plan, program, or pharmaceutical manufacturer; the prices charged for a specific drug or class of drugs; the amount of any rebates provided for a specific drug or class of drugs or the pharmaceutical manufacturer; or information that would otherwise have the potential to compromise the financial, competitive, or proprietary nature of such information. Any such information shall be protected from disclosure as confidential and proprietary and shall not be regarded as a public record pursuant to section 74-101, Idaho Code. A pharmacy benefit manager shall impose the confidentiality protections and requirements of this section on any agent or downstream third party that performs health care or administrative services on behalf of the pharmacy benefit manager that may receive or have access to such information, and the director shall impose the confidentiality protections and requirements of this section on any agent or downstream third party directly or indirectly involved in the administration of this section that may receive or have access to such information.".

COMMENDING DOUGLAS ROBERT GWIN FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE UNITED STATES AS A HIGH-SPEED RADIO OPERATOR DURING WORLD WAR II.

We, the members of the Senate of the State of Idaho assembled in the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-seventh Idaho Legislature, do hereby proclaim:

WHEREAS, Douglas Robert Gwin resides in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, and served in the United States Army in World War II. Mr. Gwin will be turning 100 years old on April 13, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gwin was selected to be in the Signal Corps and went through basic training at Camp Kohler in California. After excelling at learning Morse code, he was sent to radio school in Athens, Georgia. Mr. Gwin excelled there as well, passing 26 words per minute as a high-speed operator; and

WHEREAS, after graduation, Mr. Gwin was sent to Drew Field in Florida and assigned to the Tenth Air Force, which was operating in Burma; and

WHEREAS, he served in the Army as a high-speed radio operator from January 13, 1943, the day he was inducted, to November 19, 1945, after World War II ended; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gwin was part of a ground observer unit, responsible for recording airplanes that flew overhead, both enemy and friendly, and transmitting that information via Morse code to headquarters at airfields; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gwin's positive attitude toward life and his fierce loyalty and love for his service members and community is worthy of recognition.
