HOUSE BILL NO. 395

BY RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

1	AN ACI
2	RELATING TO FISH AND GAME; AMENDING SECTION 36-1201, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE
3	MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR THE OPERATION OF SAFE CHECK STATIONS AND TO PRO-
4	VIDE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH CERTAIN VEHICLES MAY BE STOPPED.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Section 36-1201, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

36-1201. PRODUCTION OF WILDLIFE FOR INSPECTION -- STOP AT CHECKING STATIONS -- MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR OPERATION OF SAFE CHECK STATIONS -- LICENSE MUST BE ON PERSON. No fisherman, hunter or trapper shall refuse or fail to:

- $(a\underline{1})$ Inspection of Wildlife. Upon request of the director, produce for inspection any wildlife in his possession.
- $(\frac{b2}{2})$ Check Stations. Stop and report at a wildlife check station encountered on his route of travel when directed to do so by personnel on duty. Such direction may be accomplished by signs prominently displayed along the route of travel indicating those persons required to stop.
- Minimum Standards for Operation of Safe Check Stations. Check stations shall be operated within clearly visible line of sight on both major and secondary roads and have clear visibility for a minimum of fifteen hundred (1,500) feet in both directions. Operation of check stations shall be clearly marked with signage at a minimum of fifteen hundred (1,500) feet, one thousand (1,000) feet, and five hundred (500) feet, before the check stations that plainly state that a fish and game check station is ahead, with clear instruction as to what vehicles are required to stop. Fish and game check stations are only authorized to stop licensed hunters and fishermen. Check stations shall not be used to conduct any other criminal or traffic compliance checks that are not provided for in this title 36, Idaho Code. Traffic control devices and warning signs used in connection with the operation of check stations shall meet specifications pursuant to the manual on uniform traffic control devices (MUTCD), the national cooperative highway research program (NCHRP), and the Idaho transportation department traffic manual, appropriate for all weather conditions and daylight and darkness or poor visibility conditions. All officers directing traffic shall wear high visibility clothing and shall be fully trained in directing traffic to ensure the check station is conducted safely. These are minimum standards, and in all cases where higher standards by law or safety are required the higher standards shall be applied.
- (4) License to be Carried and Exhibited on Request. Have the proper required license, temporary license, authorization number or other information required by rule, on his person at all times when hunting, fishing or trapping and produce the same for inspection upon request of a conservation

- officer or any other person authorized to enforce fish and game laws. How-
- ever, no person charged with violating this subsection shall be convicted if
- 3 he produces in court a license, theretofore issued to him and valid at the
- 4 time of his arrest.
