AN ACT RELATING TO PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING; PROVIDING LEGISLA-TIVE INTENT; AMENDING SECTION 47-1313, IDAHO CODE, TO DEFINE TERMS; AMENDING CHAPTER 13, TITLE 47, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SEC-TION 47-1325, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT SPECIFIED LAW SHALL NOT APPLY TO PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING, TO PROHIBIT REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS OR PROHIBITIONS REGARDING PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING AND TO PROVIDE EXCEPTIONS; AMENDING CHAPTER 17, TITLE 42, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 42-1734J, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT STATE COMPREHENSIVE WATER PLANS AND RELATED LAW SHALL ALLOW FOR PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING, TO PRO-VIDE THAT ANY REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS OR PROHIBITIONS UNDER SPECIFIED LAW REGARDING PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MIN-ING SHALL BE DECLARED INVALID, VOID AND UNENFORCEABLE, TO PROVIDE AN EXCEPTION AND TO DEFINE TERMS; AMENDING SECTION 42-3802, IDAHO CODE, TO DEFINE TERMS; AND AMENDING CHAPTER 38, TITLE 42, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 42-3813, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT SPECIFIED LAW SHALL NOT BE ENFORCED WITH RESPECT TO PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING, TO PROHIBIT REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS OR PROHIBITIONS REGARDING PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING AND TO PROVIDE AN EXCEPTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. The Legislature finds that prospecting and small-scale dredge mining are important parts of the heritage of the state of Idaho, provide economic benefits to federal and state government, local communities and prospectors and miners, and can be conducted in a manner that is not harmful, and may be beneficial to, fish habitat and fish propagation. Additionally, the Legislature of the state of Idaho finds that prospecting and small-scale dredge mining does not discharge or add pollutants into the involved waters and therefore is not in need of regulation under the Idaho Dredge and Placer Mining Protection Act, chapter 13, title 47, Idaho Code, and is not in need of regulation under the Idaho Stream Channel Alteration Act, chapter 38, title 42, Idaho Code, and does not need to be subject to state comprehensive water plans. The Legislature further finds that prospecting and small-scale dredge mining removes lead and other contaminants present in waters, which has long-lasting beneficial effects on the environment.

SECTION 2. That Section 47-1313, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

47-1313. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

 $(\underline{a1})$ "Board" means the state board of land commissioners or such representative as may be designated by the board.

- (b2) "Director" means the director of the department of lands or such representative as may be designated by the director.
- $(e\underline{3})$ "Disturbed land" means land, natural watercourses, or existing stockpiles and waste piles affected by placer or dredge mining, remining, exploration, stockpiling of ore or wastes from placer or dredge mining, or construction of roads, tailings ponds, structures, or facilities appurtenant to placer or dredge mining operations.
- ($\frac{44}{2}$) "Mean high watermark" has the same meaning as defined in section $\frac{42-3802}{2}$, Idaho Code.
- (5) "Mineral" means any ore, rock, or substance extracted from a placer deposit or from an existing placer stockpile or waste pile, but does not include coal, clay, stone, sand, gravel, phosphate, uranium, oil, or gas.
- (e6) "Motorized earth-moving equipment" means backhoes, bulldozers, front loaders, trenchers, core drills, suction dredges with an intake diameter exceeding eight (8) inches, and other similar equipment.
- (± 7) "Natural watercourse" means any stream in the state of Idaho having definite bed and banks, and which confines and conducts continuously flowing water.
- $(\underline{98})$ "Permit area" means that area designated under section 47-1317, Idaho Code, as the site of a proposed placer or dredge mining operation, including all lands to be disturbed by the operation.
- $(\underline{h}\underline{9})$ "Person" means any person, corporation, partnership, association, or public or governmental agency engaged in placer or dredge mining, whether individually, jointly, or through subsidiaries, agents, employees, or contractors.
- (± 10) "Placer deposit" means naturally occurring unconsolidated surficial detritus containing valuable minerals, whether located inside or outside the confines of a natural watercourse.
- $(\dot{\jmath}11)$ "Placer or dredge exploration operation" means activities including, but not limited to, the construction of roads, trenches, and test holes, performed on a placer deposit for the purpose of locating and determining the economic feasibility of extracting minerals by placer or dredge mining.
- $(\frac{12}{2})$ "Placer or dredge mining" or "dredge or other placer mining" means the extraction of minerals from a placer deposit, including remining for sale, processing, or other disposition of earth material excavated from previous placer or dredge mining. The term "dredge or other placer mining," wherever used in this chapter, is subject to this definition and all provisions regarding it.
- $(\frac{1}{2})$ "Placer or dredge mining operation" means placer or dredge mining which disturbs in excess of one-half (1/2) acre of land.
- (14) "Prospecting" means the following when conducted or occurring at or below the mean high watermark of a stream channel: (i) hand panning for the location and extraction of valuable minerals; (ii) hand shoveling for the location and extraction of valuable minerals; (iii) locating and extracting valuable minerals through the use of a nonmotorized sluice box; or (iv) locating and extracting valuable minerals through the use of a nonmotorized rocker box.

(m15) "Road" means a way, including bed, slopes, and shoulders, (1) constructed within the circular tract circumscribed by a placer or dredge mining operation, or (2) constructed solely for access to a placer or dredge mining operation or placer or dredge exploration operation, provided, that a way dedicated to public multiple use or being used by a governmental land manager or private landowner at the time of cessation of operations, and not constructed solely for access to a placer or dredge mining operation or placer or dredge exploration operation, shall not be considered a road for purposes of this act.

- (16) "Small-scale dredge mining" means the location and extraction of valuable minerals through the use of a dredge unit at or below the mean high watermark of a stream channel, provided that the dredge unit is: (i) equipped with a subsurface hose of eight (8) inches or less in diameter; (ii) powered by an engine, natural siphon or natural gravity pressure; and (iii) used to draw up mineral material, in a quantity of no greater than five (5) cubic yards per hour, to a sluice portion of the dredge unit.
- (17) "Stream channel" has the same meaning as defined in section 42-3802, Idaho Code.
- SECTION 3. That Chapter 13, Title 47, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$, to be known and designated as Section 47-1325, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
- 47-1325. INAPPLICABILITY TO PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MIN-ING. (1) The provisions of sections 47-1314 through 47-1320, Idaho Code, are not applicable to, and may not be enforced with respect to, prospecting and small-scale dredge mining, provided that small-scale dredge mining may be prohibited on national wild and scenic rivers as designated in section 47-1323, Idaho Code.
- (2) The board, director, any agency of the state of Idaho and any political subdivision of the state of Idaho shall not adopt, enact or promulgate any rule, regulation, ordinance, order, standard or other policy with the force and effect of law that would in any way regulate, restrict, limit or prohibit prospecting or small-scale dredge mining with the exception of prohibitions of small-scale dredge mining on national wild and scenic rivers as designated in section 47-1323, Idaho Code.
- (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this section shall not be construed or interpreted to prohibit or restrict the board, director, any agency of the state of Idaho and any political subdivision of the state of Idaho from enforcing or implementing any provisions of law or regulations of the United States relating to prospecting or small-scale dredge mining.
- SECTION 4. That Chapter 17, Title 42, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$, to be known and designated as Section 42-1734J, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
- 42-1734J. INAPPLICABILITY TO PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MINING. (1) All state comprehensive water plans, and related rules, regulations, ordinances, orders, standards or other policies adopted pursuant to sections 42-1734A through 42-1734I, Idaho Code, shall allow for prospecting

and small-scale dredge mining without regulation, restriction, limitation or prohibition.

- (2) Any regulations, restrictions, limitations or prohibitions currently in effect through any action pursuant to sections 42-1734A through 42-1734I, Idaho Code, with respect to prospecting and small-scale dredge mining are hereby declared invalid, void and unenforceable.
- (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this section shall not be construed or interpreted to prohibit or restrict a state comprehensive water plans, or related rules, regulations, ordinances, orders, standards or other policies adopted pursuant to sections 42-1734A through 42-1734I, Idaho Code, from enforcing or implementing any provisions of law or regulations of the United States relating to prospecting or small-scale dredge mining.
- (4) For purposes of this section, "prospecting" and "small-scale dredge mining" has the meaning set forth in section 42-3802, Idaho Code.
- SECTION 5. That Section 42-3802, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 42-3802. DEFINITIONS. Whenever used in this act, the term:
- $(a\underline{1})$ "Person" means any individual, partnership, company, corporation, municipality, county, state or federal agency, or other entity proposing to alter a stream channel.
- (b2) "Alter" means to obstruct, diminish, destroy, alter, modify, relocate, or change the natural existing shape or direction of water flow of any stream channel within or below the mean high watermark thereof.
 - (e3) "Board" means the Idaho water resource board.
- $(\underline{44})$ "Stream channel" means a natural watercourse of perceptible extent, with definite bed and banks, which confines and conducts continuously flowing water. Ditches, canals, laterals and drains that are constructed and used for irrigation or drainage purposes are not stream channels.
 - $(e\underline{5})$ "Department" means the Idaho department of water resources.
- $(\underline{\pm 6})$ "Director" means the director of the Idaho department of water resources.
- ($\underline{e7}$) "Plans" means maps, sketches, engineering drawings, word descriptions and specifications sufficient to describe the extent, nature and location of the proposed stream channel alteration and the proposed method of accomplishing same.
- (h8) "Mean high watermark" means a water level corresponding to the natural or ordinary high watermark and is the line which the water impresses on the soil by covering it for sufficient periods of time to deprive the soil of its terrestrial vegetation and destroy its value for commonly accepted agricultural purposes.
- (9) "Prospecting" has the same meaning as defined in section 47-1313, Idaho Code.
- (10) "Small-scale dredge mining" has the same meaning as defined in section 47-1313, Idaho Code.
- SECTION 6. That Chapter 38, Title 42, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$, to be known and designated as Section 42-3813, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

42-3813. INAPPLICABILITY TO PROSPECTING AND SMALL-SCALE DREDGE MIN-ING. (1) The provisions of sections 42-3802 through 42-3812, Idaho Code, are not applicable to, and may not be enforced with respect to, prospecting and small-scale dredge mining.

- (2) The board, department, director, any agency of the state of Idaho and any political subdivision of the state of Idaho shall not adopt, enact or promulgate any rule, regulation, ordinance, order, standard or other policy with the force and effect of law that would in any way regulate, restrict, limit or prohibit prospecting or small-scale dredge mining.
- (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this section shall not be construed or interpreted to prohibit or restrict the board, director, any agency of the state of Idaho and any political subdivision of the state of Idaho from enforcing or implementing any provisions of law or regulations of the United States relating to prospecting or small-scale dredge mining.
- SECTION 7. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.
