

# DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY - DEFINED

## Section 66-402(5) Idaho Code

- Chronic before age 22
- Impairment (intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism or other closely related condition)
- Substantial functional limitations in three or more life activities (self-care, receptive and expressive language, living, or economic self-sufficiency) learning, mobility self-direction, capacity for independent
- Reflects the need for a combination and sequence of and individually planned and coordinated. special interdisciplinary or generic care, treatment or other services, which are of life-long or extended duration




- Conducted five (5) studies to inform our understanding


