

## STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

### RS24891

The purpose of this bill is to enhance the use and functionality of the state's Prescription Monitoring Program ("PMP") database. Specifically, this bill allows medical and pharmacy students to access the PMP as a delegate of a supervising practitioner or pharmacist; limits the Board of Pharmacy's recordkeeping of PMP data to five (5) years; and requires one-time pharmacist registration for free PMP access in a manner similar to what is required for prescribers.

### FISCAL NOTE

This legislation will have no fiscal impact to the General Fund or the Board of Pharmacy's dedicated fund. It has no fiscal impact because the costs of operationalizing the requirements are covered under the Board of Pharmacy's existing Prescription Monitoring Program licensing agreement.
