- 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
- SECTION 1. That Section 33-2102, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - 33-2102. COURSES OF STUDY. A community college established pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall give instruction in academic subjects, and in such nonacademic subjects as shall be authorized by its board of trustees.

The academic courses given and the instruction therein shall be of the same standard as the same are given and taught in the first two (2) years of any other state institution of higher education, and credits therefor shall be accepted by other state institutions for credit toward a baccalaureate degree, as more specifically set forth and required by section 33-3728, Idaho Code.

- SECTION 2. That Section 33-2205, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 33-2205. STATE BOARD TO APPOINT ADMINISTRATOR -- DESIGNATION OF ASSISTANTS -- DIVISION OF CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION -- DUTIES AND POWERS. (1) The state board of education shall appoint a person to serve as an administrator to the state board for career technical education, who shall be known as the administrator of career technical education. The administrator shall designate, by and with the advice and consent of the state board for career technical education, such assistants as may be necessary to properly carry out the provisions of the federal acts and this chapter for the state of Idaho. The administrator and such assistants shall together be known as the division of career technical education.
- (2) The administrator of career technical education shall also carry into effect such rules as the state board for career technical education may adopt, and shall coordinate all efforts in career technical education approved by the board with the executive secretary, and shall prepare such reports concerning the condition of career technical education in the state as the state board for career technical education may require.

(3) The division of career technical education shall coordinate with the Idaho digital learning academy to provide approved online career technical education courses to any Idaho school district.

- (4) The division of career technical education may provide incentives to Idaho public colleges and universities offering career technical programs that, in coordination with the division, align their foundational courses that are required in the same or substantially similar programs of study so as to achieve uniformity and transferability in the core program requirements at all such public colleges and universities. The purpose of uniformity is to ensure that pPostsecondary credits earned by a student in a career technical education program will shall transfer at the full credit value to any public Idaho college or university in a like program of study and to ensure that such postsecondary credits will be treated by any such public college or university as satisfying specific course requirements in the student's such program of study.
- (5) The state board of education may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of subsections (3) and (4) of this section.
- SECTION 3. That Chapter 37, Title 33, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a  $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$ , to be known and designated as Section 33-3728, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
- 33-3728. TRANSFER OF CREDITS. (1) As used in this section, "regionally accredited postsecondary institution" means an institution that is accredited by a regional accreditation organization that is recognized and in good standing with the United States department of education and that accredits entire colleges and universities rather than only courses or courses of study.
- (2) All credits awarded a student by a regionally accredited postsecondary institution in Idaho shall transfer to any public college or university in Idaho admitting such student at full value toward the satisfaction of prerequisites and all other course requirements at the receiving institution and shall not be subject to further approval by the receiving institution, or any of its functionaries, except as provided in this section.
- (3) Students transferring to any public college or university in Idaho shall be deemed to have satisfied all general education requirements as defined in the state board of education policies or rules upon completing the requirements for the associate of arts or associate of science degree, or upon satisfactorily completing the thirty-six (36) credit general education framework, as defined in the state board of education policies or rules, at regionally accredited postsecondary institutions in Idaho, and will not be required to complete any additional general education requirements at the receiving institution.
- (4) Students transferring to any public college or university in Idaho shall be deemed to have satisfied all general education matriculated courses as defined in state board of education policies or rules upon completing the requirements for the associate of applied science degree at a regionally accredited public postsecondary institution in Idaho, and such courses will be applied towards the associated general education matriculated competency at the receiving institution.

(5) All general education matriculated credits, as defined in state board of education policies or rules, earned at a regionally accredited public postsecondary institution in Idaho by a student who has not completed the entire thirty-six (36) credit general education framework, as defined in state board of education policies or rules, or who has not completed the requirements for an associate of arts or associate of science degree, shall be deemed to transfer with the student to any public college or university in Idaho and shall be applied toward the associated general education matriculated competency requirements at the receiving institution.

- (6) Students transferring to any four (4) year Idaho public college or university who hold an associate of applied science degree from a regionally accredited Idaho public postsecondary institution may pursue an interdisciplinary bachelor of applied science or a bachelor of applied technology degree focused on upper-level academic coursework at the receiving institution.
- (7) Whenever a receiving institution decides not to transfer credits in the manner requested by a student or applicant, or whenever an employee of the receiving institution orally expresses doubt to the student or applicant about the transferability of the student's credits, the receiving institution must provide a written copy of this initial decision to the student or applicant and to the institution's president. The president shall, within fourteen (14) calendar days of receiving the initial decision, notify the student or applicant and the state board of education in writing of his or her decision affirming, modifying or reversing the initial decision and the reasons therefor. Within fourteen (14) calendar days of receiving the president's decision, the state board of education's designee shall notify the student or applicant, the president and the state board of education in writing of his or her decision affirming, modifying or reversing the initial decision and the reasons therefor. The board shall thereafter affirm, reverse or modify its designee's action at its next regular meeting with written notice of its action to the student or applicant and the institution's president. The credits at issue will be treated in the manner directed by the state board of education's designee until the board takes action on the matter.
- (8) No Idaho public college or university shall discriminate against any applicant for admission or against any student because of credits that he or she may be able to transfer, or has transferred, to the public college or university pursuant to this section, any other provision of law, or any rule, policy, guideline or practice of the state board of education or the public college or university.
  - (9) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to:
  - (a) Invalidate any requirement that a student earn a specified number of credits at an Idaho public college or university in order to receive a degree from the institution;
  - (b) Require any Idaho public college or university to grant a student a degree within a specified period of time; or
  - (c) Amend the provisions of section 33-2205(4), Idaho Code, or expand the rights of career technical education students or applicants with respect to the transfer of credits from one institution to another.

(10) All Idaho public colleges and universities shall publish the current curriculum equivalencies of all courses on the state transfer web portal.

(11) The state board of education may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.
