Advanced Opportunities is aligned to the SDE's Strategic Plan.

Goal 1- All Idaho students persevere in life and are ready for college and careers

Strategy 1.3: Implement multiple pathways to graduation

- Investigate alternate routes to graduation
- Promote and emphasize career coaches and teacher-to-student mentoring
- Provide advanced opportunities to all students (TF 4)



Advanced Opportunities are defined in State Board Policy IIIY as dual credit, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and Career and Technical Education.

Previously there were four different funding programs for students that participated in Advanced Opportunities, these included the Mastery Advancement Pilot Program (2011), 8 in 6 (2012), Dual Credit for Early Completers (2013), and the Fast Forward Program (2014). Because of the complex technical intricacies of implementing each of these, the programs were streamlined into one Fast Forward program in 2016, which can now be found in Idaho code 33-4601 and 33-4602. The following reflects activity for FY 16:

Every \$1.00 of taxpayer funds spent on dual credit tuition through Advanced Opportunities results in a savings of \$3.36 to Idaho families that have students headed for college. In FY 16, high school students earned 96.8% of all dual credits that were attempted.

Many school districts are taking a systems-approach to develop and streamline district procedures, timelines, and advising surrounding Advanced Opportunities. Twin Falls is an example of one such district who put together professional development at the beginning of the year with nearly 40 people; they brought together administrators, career advisors, counselors, SDE personnel, the CSI dean and others to discuss best practices and an implementation plan for their district.

Transactions for the Fast Forward program are processed through the Advanced Opportunities Portal managed by the SDE, using the following process:

- 1. Student creates account
- 2. School personnel approves account (steps 1 & 2 only occur once)
- 3. Student requests funds for course/exam
- 4. School personnel approves funding request
- 5. Course providers verify enrollment for all courses (100% match)
- 6. District personnel submit to the SDE
- 7. SDE personnel validate all data, checking for errors, and makes payments to districts and public post-secondary institutions

Feedback from the field is regularly considered and updates to the portal are made at least annually to provide efficiency to this process.
