2	RELATING TO HEALTH AND WELFARE; AMENDING CHAPTER 2, TITLE 56, IDAHO CODE, BY
3 4	THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 56-268, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING AN EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAM.
5	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
6	SECTION 1. That Chapter 2, Title 56, Idaho Code, be, and the same is
7	hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u> , to be known and des-
8	ignated as Section 56-268, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
9	56-268. EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAM. (1) There is hereby estab-
10	lished in the department of health and welfare an employment and training
11	program available to:
12	(a) Persons with an income at or below one hundred eighty-five percent
13	(185%) of the federal poverty level; and
14	(b) Persons who have recently lost eligibility for public assistance
15	due to an increase in income.
16	(2) To enroll in the employment and training program, a person must:
17	(a) Develop a plan, with the assistance of a qualified nonprofit organ-
18 19	ization identified by the department, to achieve financial stability. The plan's description should include a statement of how funds fur-
19 20	nished pursuant to subsection (4) of this section would assist with such
20 21	achievement; and
22	(b) Attend a financial literacy or health coaching program offered by
23	a qualified nonprofit organization identified by the department. For
24	purposes of this subsection, a qualified nonprofit organization is an
25	organization that:
26	(i) Qualifies for tax-exempt status under 501(c)(3) of the inter-
27	nal revenue code; and
28	(ii) Has at least two (2) years of experience in:
29	1. Working with those in poverty and offering a financial
30	literacy course that covers the major areas of personal fi-
31	nance; or
32	2. Providing a health coaching program with a curriculum
33	that has been successful in helping individuals who follow
34	the course improve their health.
35	(3) Subject to available state funding, persons may participate in the

(a) For up to six (6) months, if the person qualifies based on income; or

(b) For up to three (3) months, if the person recently lost eligibility

(4) Participants in the program shall be granted five hundred dollars

for public assistance due to an increase in income.

(a) Workforce training;

(\$500) that may be used for:

employment and training program:

- 1 (b) Expenses related to health care, such as deposit in a medical sav-2 ings account; or
 - (c) Other uses identified by the department.

4 (5) The department is authorized to take such actions as are necessary to implement and enforce the provisions of this section.
