- Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
- 9 SECTION 1. That Chapter 10, Title 54, Idaho Code, be, and the same is 10 hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and des-11 ignated as Section 54-1011, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
 - 54-1011. DIRECT SUPERVISION. (1) It is the responsibility of an employing electrical contractor to ensure that apprentices perform electrical work only under the direct supervision of a journeyman electrician. It is the responsibility of an employing electrical contractor to determine how to provide such supervision on a case-by-case basis, including with respect to how many apprentices a journeyman electrician may supervise.
 - (2) There is no journeyman electrician-to-apprentice ratio. A journeyman electrician may supervise as many apprentices as may be provided direct supervision pursuant to this section.
 - (3) Failure to provide direct supervision of an apprentice pursuant to this section may be grounds for suspension or revocation of an electrical contractor's license.
 - (4) For purposes of this section, "direct supervision" means a journey-man maintaining a constant presence on the permitted job site.
 - SECTION 2. That Chapter 10, Title 54, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$, to be known and designated as Section 54-1012, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
 - 54-1012. APPRENTICE EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS. In addition to other educational requirements for completion of an electrical apprenticeship as may be provided for under law or rule, an apprentice must annually complete eight (8) hours of NFPA 70E training.
