7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Title 73, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW CHAPTER</u>, to be known and designated as Chapter 5, Title 73, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

11 CHAPTER 5 12 BUSINESS BILL OF RIGHTS

73-501. SHORT TITLE. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Business Bill of Rights."

73-502. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Business" means any undertaking operated for economic gain, including but not limited to a corporation, partnership, trust, proprietorship, firm, association, or joint venture.
- (2) "Governmental entity" means the state of Idaho and all agencies, commissions, and other governmental bodies of the state, all counties and municipalities of the state, all other political subdivisions, including but not limited to health boards, employees, or elected officials of any of the governmental entities identified in this definition, and any governmental bodies, officials, or employees not specifically mentioned in this chapter.
- (3) "Occupational or professional licensure" means a license, certificate, registration, permit, or other authorization of any person to practice a profession or occupation issued by a licensing authority, as that term is defined in section 67-9403, Idaho Code.
- 73-503. STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT PROHIBITIONS. During any disaster emergency declared by the governor or any public health order issued by a governmental entity, a governmental entity shall not:
- (1) Revoke or threaten to revoke a business license or liquor license because such business remains open;
- (2) Revoke or threaten to revoke the occupational or professional licensure of a business owner or employee because such business remains open;
- (3) Fine, sanction, or seize funds or assets of a business because such business remains open; or

(4) Require a business to close, to reduce its hours, to alter its manner of business operations, or to otherwise restrict such business in its manner of operation, including with respect to access by employees, customers, suppliers, consultants, or contractors.

73-504. TERMINATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY OR PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER. A violation of section 73-503, Idaho Code, shall result in the termination of any disaster emergency or public health order, or both, in place when a governmental entity engages in a prohibited action against a business.
