H 222	Relating to Education; Amends Existing Law to Provide for a Commission on Continuous Improvement Plans and Student Achievement Measures and to Revise Provisions Regarding Staff Evaluations, College and Career Advising, and Literacy Intervention. Senator Lent and Representative Ryan Kerby presented the bill to the Committee.
TESTIMONY:	Quinn Perry , on behalf of Idaho School Boards Association; Blake Youde , on behalf of Idaho Charter School Network; Andy Grover , on behalf of the Idaho Association of School Administrators; Marilyn Whitney , Deputy Superintendent, State Board of Education, all testified in support of H 222 . They said the continuous improvement plan in the bill is a school board document. It provides an opportunity for schools to work with their boards to align their goals and performance to streamline reporting requirements.
