**APPROVAL:** Ward-Engelking seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote.

H 654: Senator Cook presented H 654 which authorizes certain professionals to

work as school counselors. Senator Cook explained that if they meet the requirements of the Idaho State Board of Education (SBOE), then the licensee's would be included in the legal definition as a school counselor. This would allow those people that had private sector opportunities to be a school counselor still

and meet the requirements of SBOE.

**TESTIMONY:** Scott Woolstenhulme, is in support of H 654 which will meet the mental health

needs of students who need qualified professionals.

Ken Marlowe, is in support of H 654 which will provide qualified professionals to

school systems in Idaho.

Layne McInelly, is in support of H 654 due to the increase in behavioral issues and

the diminishment of social skills among students.

Marilyn Whitney, is in support of H 654, which will help address social and

emotional well-being for students. **Quinn Perry**, is in support of **H 654**.

H 656: Representative Yamamoto presented H 656 which provides for placement

Representative Yamamoto explained that superintendents are having a hard time placing teachers from out of state and now administrators who are in state, choosing to go back into the classroom to appropriately be recognized for their years of experience on

the career ladder.

**TESTIMONY:** Layne McInelly is in support of H 656 as a way to give school districts the

additional financial resources to cover the deficit of placing a veteran educator on

the career ladder.
