IDAPA 24.23.01 - Rules of the Speech and Hearing Services Licensure Board - Temporary and Proposed Rule (Docket No. 24-2301-1401)

The Bureau of Occupational Licenses submits notice of temporary and proposed rulemaking on behalf of the Speech and Hearing Licensure Board. The proposed rule changes the definition of "quorum" to require that at least one board member of the relevant profession is present when any board action is taken that affects the profession, its licensees, or applicants. This change is consistent with changes made by House Bill No. 357 passed during the 2014 legislative session.

There is no negative fiscal impact to the general fund as a result of this rulemaking. Negotiated rulemaking was not conducted because the rule was prompted by and is consistent with the changes made to the governing statute by House Bill No. 357.

The Board's temporary and proposed rule is consistent with Section 54-2909, Idaho Code, and is authorized by Section 54-2910, Idaho Code.

TEMPORARY RULE JUSTIFICATION: Pursuant to Section(s) 67-5226(1) (b), Idaho Code, the Governor has found that temporary adoption of the rule is appropriate for the following reasons:

House Bill 357 passed by the 2014 Legislature amends the Board's definition of a quorum. The change provides that a quorum can be established if at least one member of the relevant profession is present when taking action that affects the profession, its applicants or licensees. The change to the rules is necessary to conform with statute.

THE FOLLOWING IS THE TEMPORARY RULE AND THE PROPOSED TEXT OF DOCKET NO. 24-2301-1401

(Only those Sections being amended are shown.)

100. ORGANIZATION (RULE 100).

- **01. Meetings**. The Board shall meet not less than twice annually and at other such times and places as designated by the Board or the Chairman of the Board. Special meetings may be held at the call of the Chairman, and all members shall be notified. (3-30-06)
- **a.** All meetings shall be held in accordance with the Idaho Open Meeting Law, Sections 67-2340 through 67-2347, Idaho Code. (3-30-06)
- **b.** Four (4) members of the Board shall constitute a quorum, provided at least one (1) <u>audiologist</u>, <u>one</u> (1) <u>speech-language pathologist</u>, <u>the hearing aid dealer and fitter member and the public board</u> member <u>are of the relevant profession is present when any board action is taken that affects the profession, its licensees, or applicants.</u> The Board may act by virtue of a majority vote of members present in which a quorum is present. The Chairman may vote only in the event of a tie vote.

- **Organization of the Board**. At the first meeting of each fiscal year, the Board shall elect from its members a Chairman, who shall assume the duty of the office immediately upon such selection. (3-30-06)
- **a.** The Chairman shall when present, preside at all meetings, appoint with the consent of the Board, all committees, and shall otherwise perform all duties pertaining to the office of Chairman. The Chairman shall be an exofficio member of all committees. (3-30-06)
- **b.** The Chief of the Bureau shall act as an agent of the Board and shall be the official keeper of all records of the Board. The Bureau shall provide such services as may be authorized by Chapter 26, Title 67, Idaho Code, and as defined under contract between the Bureau and the Board. (3-30-06)
