AN ACT

1 RELATING TO ADJUSTMENTS TO TAXABLE INCOME; AMENDING SECTION 63-3022, IDAHO
2 CODE, TO PROVIDE A DEDUCTION FOR CERTAIN HEALTH CARE AND MEDICAL SER-
3 VICES COSTS WITH LIMITATIONS AND TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; REPEAL-
4 ING SECTION 63-3022P, IDAHO CODE, RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE COSTS;
5 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING RETROACTIVE APPLICATION.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

8 SECTION 1. That Section 63-3022, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
9 amended to read as follows:

10 63-3022. ADJUSTMENTS TO TAXABLE INCOME. The additions and subtrac-
11 tions set forth in this section, and in sections 63-3022A through 63-3022R,
12 Idaho Code, are to be applied to the extent allowed in computing Idaho tax-
13 able income:

14 (a) Add any state and local taxes, as defined in section 164 of the In-
15 ternal Revenue Code that are measured by net income, or for which a credit is
16 allowable under section 63-3029, Idaho Code, and paid or accrued during the
17 taxable year adjusted for state or local tax refunds used in arriving at tax-
18 able income.

19 (b) Add the net operating loss deduction used in arriving at taxable in-
20 come.

21 (c) (1) A net operating loss for any taxable year commencing on and af-
22 ter January 1, 2000, but before January 1, 2013, shall be a net operating
23 loss carryback not to exceed a total of one hundred thousand dollars
24 (\$100,000) to the two (2) immediately preceding taxable years. At the
25 election of the taxpayer, the two (2) year carryback may be ~~foregone~~
26 forgone and the loss subtracted from income received in taxable years
27 arising in the next twenty (20) years succeeding the taxable year in
28 which the loss arises in order until exhausted. The election shall be
29 made as under section 172(b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. An elec-
30 tion under this subsection must be in the manner prescribed in the rules
31 of the state tax commission and once made is irrevocable for the year in
32 which it is made.

33 (2) A net operating loss for any taxable year commencing on or after
34 January 1, 2013, shall be a net operating loss carryback not to exceed
35 a total of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to the two (2) imme-
36 diately preceding taxable years only if an amended return carrying the
37 loss back is filed within one (1) year of the end of the taxable year of
38 the net operating loss that results in such carryback.

39 (3) Any portion of the net operating loss not subtracted from income in
40 the two (2) preceding years may be subtracted from income in the next
41 twenty (20) years succeeding the taxable year in which the loss arises
42 in order until exhausted. The sum of the deductions may not exceed the

1 amount of the net operating loss deduction incurred. The carryback
2 shall be limited to a total of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in the
3 case of an individual filing as married filing separate in the year of
4 the loss.

5 (4) Net operating losses incurred by a corporation during a year in
6 which such corporation did not transact business in Idaho or was not
7 included in a group of corporations combined under subsection (t) of
8 section 63-3027, Idaho Code, may not be subtracted. However, if at
9 least one (1) corporation within a group of corporations combined under
10 subsection (t) of section 63-3027, Idaho Code, was transacting business
11 in Idaho during the taxable year in which the loss was incurred, then the
12 net operating loss may be subtracted. Net operating losses incurred by
13 a person, other than a corporation, in activities not taxable by Idaho
14 may not be subtracted.

15 (5) The term "income" as used in this subsection ~~(e)~~ means Idaho taxable
16 income as defined in this chapter as modified by section 63-3021 (b) (2),
17 (3) and (4), Idaho Code.

18 (d) In the case of a corporation, add the amount deducted under the pro-
19 visions of sections 243(a) and (c), 244, 245 and 246A of the Internal Revenue
20 Code (relating to dividends received by corporations) as limited by section
21 246(b) (1) of said code.

22 (e) In the case of a corporation, subtract an amount determined under
23 section 78 of the Internal Revenue Code to be taxable as dividends.

24 (f) Subtract the amount of any income received or accrued during the
25 taxable year which is exempt from taxation by this state, under the provi-
26 sions of any other law of this state or a law of the United States, if not pre-
27 viously subtracted in arriving at taxable income.

28 (g) For the purpose of determining the Idaho taxable income of the bene-
29 ficiary of a trust or of an estate:

30 (1) Distributable net income as defined for federal tax purposes shall
31 be corrected for the other adjustments required by this section.

32 (2) Net operating losses attributable to a beneficiary of a trust or es-
33 tate under section 642 of the Internal Revenue Code shall be a deduction
34 for the beneficiary to the extent that income from the trust or estate
35 would be attributable to this state under the provisions of this chap-
36 ter.

37 (h) In the case of an individual who is on active duty as a full-time
38 officer, enlistee or draftee, with the armed forces of the United States,
39 which full-time duty is or will be continuous and uninterrupted for one hun-
40 dred twenty (120) consecutive days or more, deduct compensation paid by the
41 armed forces of the United States for services performed outside this state.
42 The deduction is allowed only to the extent such income is included in tax-
43 able income.

44 (i) In the case of a corporation, including any corporation included
45 in a group of corporations combined under subsection (t) of section 63-3027,
46 Idaho Code, add any capital loss or passive loss deducted which loss was in-
47 curred during any year in which such corporation did not transact business in
48 Idaho. However, do not add any capital loss deducted if a corporation, in-
49 cluding any corporation in a group of corporations combined under subsection
50 (t) of section 63-3027, Idaho Code, was transacting business in Idaho dur-

1 ing the taxable year in which the loss was incurred. In the case of persons
2 other than corporations, add any capital loss or passive loss deducted which
3 was incurred in activities not taxable by Idaho at the time such loss was in-
4 curred. In computing the income taxable to an S corporation or partnership
5 under this section, deduction shall not be allowed for a carryover or carry-
6 back of a net operating loss provided for in subsection (c) of this section,
7 a passive loss or a capital loss provided for in section 1212 of the Internal
8 Revenue Code.

9 (j) In the case of an individual, there shall be allowed as a deduction
10 from gross income either paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection at the op-
11 tion of the taxpayer:

12 (1) The standard deduction as defined in section 63, Internal Revenue
13 Code.

14 (2) Itemized deductions as defined in section 63 of the Internal Rev-
15 enue Code except state or local taxes measured by net income and general
16 sales taxes as either is defined in section 164 of the Internal Revenue
17 Code.

18 (k) Add the taxable amount of any lump sum distribution excluded from
19 gross income for federal income tax purposes under the ten (10) year averag-
20 ing method. The taxable amount will include the ordinary income portion and
21 the amount eligible for the capital gain election.

22 (l) Deduct any amounts included in gross income under the provisions of
23 section 86 of the Internal Revenue Code relating to certain social security
24 and railroad benefits.

25 (m) In the case of a self-employed individual, deduct the actual cost
26 of premiums paid to secure worker's compensation insurance for coverage in
27 Idaho, if such cost has not been deducted in arriving at taxable income.

28 (n) In the case of an individual, deduct the amount contributed to a
29 college savings program pursuant to chapter 54, title 33, Idaho Code, but not
30 more than four thousand dollars (\$4,000) per tax year. If the contribution
31 is made on or before April 15, 2001, it may be deducted for tax year 2000 and
32 an individual can make another contribution and claim the deduction accord-
33 ing to the limits provided in this subsection during 2001 for tax year 2001,
34 as long as the contribution is made on or before December 31, 2001.

35 (o) In the case of an individual, add the amount of a nonqualified with-
36 drawal from an individual trust account or savings account established pur-
37 suant to chapter 54, title 33, Idaho Code, less any amount of such nonqual-
38 ified withdrawal included in the individual's federal gross income pursuant
39 to section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code.

40 (p) In the case of an individual, add the amount of a withdrawal from an
41 individual trust account or savings account established pursuant to chapter
42 54, title 33, Idaho Code, transferred to a qualified tuition program, as de-
43 fined in section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code, that is operated by a state
44 other than Idaho. The addition provided in this subsection is limited to the
45 amount of the contributions to the Idaho individual trust account or savings
46 account by the account owner that were deducted on the account owner's income
47 tax return for the year of the transfer and the prior taxable year.

48 (q) In the case of an individual for tax year 2016, deduct thirty-three
49 and one-third percent (33.33%) of the amount paid for prescription drugs
50 or products, health care and medical services deductible under section 213

1 of the Internal Revenue Code that were not reimbursed by health insurance,
2 other third-party payor or allowed as an itemized deduction as provided
3 in subsection (j) of this section after taking into account the seven and
4 one-half percent (7.5%) or ten percent (10%) threshold for medical expenses.
5 For tax year 2017, deduct sixty-seven percent (67%) of the amount paid for
6 prescription drugs or products, health care and medical services deductible
7 under section 213 of the Internal Revenue Code that were not reimbursed by
8 health insurance, other third-party payor or allowed as an itemized de-
9 duction as provided in subsection (j) of this section after taking into
10 account the seven and one-half percent (7.5%) or ten percent (10%) thresh-
11 old for medical expenses. For tax years on and after tax year 2018, deduct
12 the amount paid for prescription drugs or products, health care and medical
13 services deductible under section 213 of the Internal Revenue Code that were
14 not reimbursed by health insurance, other third-party payor or allowed as
15 an itemized deduction as provided in subsection (j) of this section after
16 taking into account the seven and one-half percent (7.5%) or ten percent
17 (10%) threshold for medical expenses. Amounts deductible pursuant to this
18 subsection include, but are not limited to, doctor's visits, hospital stays,
19 co-pays, deductibles, physical therapy services, chiropractic services or
20 any other health profession licensed pursuant to title 54, Idaho Code, but do
21 not include payments for over-the-counter drugs or therapies.

22 SECTION 2. That Section [63-3022P](#), Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
23 repealed.

24 SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby
25 declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its
26 passage and approval, and retroactively to January 1, 2016.
