A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE OPPOSING ANY PROPOSALS THAT BAR IDAHO HUNTERS, ANGLERS AND TRAPPERS FROM ACCESSING STATE ENDOWMENT TRUST LAND ON THE BASIS OF EXCLUSIVITY, ENCOURAGING THE STATE BOARD OF LAND COMMISSIONERS TO PRESERVE AND PROMOTE REASONABLE AND EQUITABLE ACCESS TO STATE ENDOWMENT TRUST LAND FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL IDAHOANS, URGING THE STATE BOARD OF LAND COMMISSIONERS TO PROVIDE YEAR-ROUND ACCESS TO LEGALLY ACCESSIBLE STATE ENDOWMENT TRUST LAND FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION, INCLUDING HUNTING, FISHING, TRAPPING AND CAMPING AND URGING THE STATE BOARD OF LAND COMMISSIONERS TO DENY ANY EXCLUSIVE HUNTING OR FISHING LEASES ON STATE ENDOWMENT TRUST LAND.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, hunting, fishing and trapping are central to Idaho's western heritage; and

WHEREAS, hunting, fishing and outdoor recreation contribute more than \$6 billion annually to the Idaho economy; and

WHEREAS, more than 77,000 Idahoans are employed in hunting, fishing and outdoor recreation jobs; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho Department of Lands manages more than 2.4 million acres of state endowment trust land for the State of Idaho pursuant to Section 8, Article IX, of the Constitution of the State of Idaho; and

WHEREAS, hunters and anglers, as taxpaying citizens of Idaho, expect reasonable and equitable access to state endowment trust land; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho Department of Lands has received written proposals that would grant exclusive hunting and fishing access on state endowment trust land and lock Idahoans out. The Idaho Department of Lands is obligated to consider these proposals pursuant to Section 8, Article IX, of the Constitution of the State of Idaho; and

WHEREAS, hunters and anglers enjoy abundant access to state endowment trust land; and

WHEREAS, hunters and anglers are allowed year-round access to state endowment trust land; and

WHEREAS, hunters and anglers are allowed to camp, with limited exception, anywhere on lands managed by the Idaho Department of Lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-third Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that we are opposed to any proposals that bar Idaho hunters, anglers and trappers from accessing state endowment trust land on the basis of exclusivity.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we encourage the State Board of Land Commissioners to preserve and promote reasonable and equitable access to state endowment trust land for the benefit of all Idahoans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to ensure the greatest amount of public access to state endowment trust land, the State Board of Land Commissioners is urged to provide year-round access to all legally accessible state endowment trust land for outdoor recreation, including hunting, fishing, trapping and camping.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to prevent the erosion of Idaho's outdoor heritage, the State Board of Land Commissioners is urged to deny any exclusive hunting or fishing leases on state endowment trust land.
