STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

RS26994

Cooperatives that distribute electric power and that provide telecommunications and broadband services to their members in rural Idaho are member-owned and member-managed in virtually all respects. They even set their own service rates and determine their own service standards without PUC oversight. Because they are member-owned and member-managed, in many states these cooperatives are specifically exempted from state unclaimed property laws. This legislation would bring Idaho into line with the many other states that have historically exempted patronage capital credits from unclaimed property statutes and allow these cooperatives to decide how to deal with their unclaimed capital credits and either be exempt from or subject to the State's unclaimed property laws as they choose.

FISCAL NOTE

There is no fiscal impact to the State or any local government entity because the capital credits belong to the cooperatives and their members, not to the State or local governments.
