Chairman Mendive called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.
MOTION: **Rep. Wagoner** made a motion to approve the minutes of January 24, 2019. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
RS 26765: **Brody Aston**, Westerberg and Associates, explained the purpose of **RS 26765** is to allow a period of up to six months after being hired for a building inspector or plans examiner to obtain the ICC certification. **RS 26765** also provides for situations when a certified building inspector must review and approve adverse actions deemed necessary by the newly hired unlicensed building inspector.
MOTION: **Rep. Barbieri** made a motion to introduce **RS 26765** and recommended it be sent to the second reading calendar. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Wagoner** will sponsor the bill on the floor.
Director of the Office of Performance Evaluations, **Rakesh Mohan**; **Amanda Bartlett**, Principal Evaluator OPE; and **Lauren Bailey**, Evaluator at OPE explained how and why mandates become difficult for counties to implement. The presentation focused on: which state mandates are the most burdensome, what factors help or impede counties, and what strategies are used to manage burdensome mandates.
