RS 26793: Chairman Harris announced RS 26793, legislation relating to firearms will be

postponed to a later meeting date.

DOCKET NO. Jim Hammond, Idaho State Racing Commission, presented **Docket No.**

11-0411-1802: 11-0411-1802, rules governing equine veterinary practices, permitted medications,

banned substances and drug testing of horses. Mr. Hammond stated the temporary rule proposes adding hair testing to the current set of horse testing the Idaho

Racing Commission does.

DOCKET NO: Mr. Han

11-0403-1801:

Mr. Hammond presented Docket No. 11-0403-1801, rules governing licensing

and fees. This temporary rule imposes a fee for the hair testing.

In response to committee questions, **Mr. Hammond** answered the rules were not an initiative of the Idaho State Racing Commission, but rather brought by the horseman to align with other states' testing standards and rules. Mr. Hammond answered the negotiated rule making process has not taken place because the

rules have not been made final.

Mr. Hammond introduced **Ardie Noyes**, Operations Manager, Idaho State Racing Commission to answer committee questions. Ms. Noyes answered the cost of blood testing will increase due to the addition of the hair testing to the overall

testing process.

MOTION: Rep. Armstrong made a motion to reject Docket No. 11-0411-1802. Motion

MOTION: Rep. Andrus made a motion to reject Docket No. 11-0403-1801. Motion carried

by voice vote.

RS 26730C1: Rep. Gestrin presented RS 26730C1, legislation relating to liquor licenses in a

year-round resort. Legislation was passed in 2006 to provide for liquor licenses in resort communities. However, the proposed legislation would make a few technical corrections to the statute. The proposed changes would include the word "boundary" as part of the descriptive area of the resort among other language

corrections.

MOTION: Rep. Gannon made a motion to introduce RS 26730C1. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 26572:	Rep. Scott presented RS 26572 , legislation relating to firearms and retired law enforcement officers. H 565 was passed last year which allows retired law enforcement officers to carry firearms in schools and large events with a 218 card. The proposed legislation would change the minimum years to qualify for the card from fifteen to ten years in order to align with federal statute.

The American Legion is the largest veteran service organization in the United States.
