STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

RS28922 / H0372

This is the FY 2022 original appropriation bill and the FY 2021 supplemental appropriation bill for the Department of Education.

The Department of Education is an executive agency of the State Board of Education and is established pursuant to Section 33-125, Idaho Code. The Superintendent of Public Instruction serves as the executive officer of the department and has the responsibility for carrying out policies, procedures, and duties authorized by law or established by the board for all elementary and secondary school matters.

For FY 2021: The bill provides onetime funding for the department to 1) support public school districts and public charter schools with federal COVID-19 relief funds; 2) support non-public schools with federal COVID-19 relief funds; and 3) collect and assist public schools with data needed for the P-EBT child nutrition program that will provide food stamp debit cards to low-income students to receive food as a result of the pandemic; an estimated 71,000 school-age children will receive this support.

For FY 2022: This bill includes funding consistent with other state agencies for employee compensation and benefits. The bill also addresses funding adjustments for five enhancements. There are two grants included: the first is aimed at addressing professional development for disabled children in grades K-3; and the second is for addressing mental health services in rural schools through a pilot project. This bill provides funding for department staff to continue to assist public and non-public schools with federal COVID-19 relief funds. The bill removes funding that is in excess of expenditures and is used to have the Office of the State Board of Education pay the statutory requirement for being a member of the Education Commission for the States. Finally, this bill provides reappropriation authority for the non-public schools assistance and child nutrition adjustments appropriated in FY 2021.
