- RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE FOR 2 FISCAL YEAR 2022; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND 3 WELFARE FOR THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES DIVISION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022; 4 5 LIMITING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS; PROVIDING FOR GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS TO THE COOPERATIVE WELFARE FUND; 6 DIRECTING EXPENDITURES FOR TRUSTEE AND BENEFIT PAYMENTS; PROVIDING 7 REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM INTEGRITY; DIRECTING THE USE OF MONEYS FOR 8 SUICIDE PREVENTION AND AWARENESS; APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING MON-9 10 EYS FROM THE COOPERATIVE WELFARE FUND TO THE RURAL PHYSICIAN INCENTIVE FUND; DIRECTING THE USE OF MONEYS FOR PROJECT ECHO; AND ALLOCATING FUND-11 ING FOR THE HOME VISITATION PROGRAM. 12
- 13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Health and Welfare for the Public Health Services Division the following amounts to be expended according to the designated programs and expense classes from the listed funds for the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022:

SECTION 2. FTP AUTHORIZATION. In accordance with Section 67-3519, Idaho Code, each of the programs in the Department of Health and Welfare listed below is authorized no more than the following number of full-time equivalent positions at any point during the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, unless specifically authorized by the Governor. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee will be notified promptly of any increased positions so authorized.

SECTION 3. GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS. As appropriated, the Office of the
State Controller shall periodically make transfers from the General Fund to
the Cooperative Welfare Fund as requested by the director of the Department
of Health and Welfare and approved by the Board of Examiners.

SECTION 4. TRUSTEE AND BENEFIT PAYMENTS. Notwithstanding the provi sions of Section 67-3511, Idaho Code, funds appropriated in the trustee and
benefit payments expense class shall not be transferred to any other expense
classes during fiscal year 2022.

SECTION 5. PROGRAM INTEGRITY. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Health and Welfare shall be required to provide those services authorized or mandated by law in each program, only to the extent of funding and available resources appropriated for each budgeted program.

6 SECTION 6. SUICIDE PREVENTION AND AWARENESS. The amount appropriated in Section 1 of this act for the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program 7 shall be used in accordance with the plan developed by the various stakehold-8 ers as required by Section 6, Chapter 340, Laws of 2018. Further, the program 9 10 shall continue to work with all relevant stakeholders to maximize the moneys appropriated for this purpose. The department shall provide a report to the 11 Legislative Services Office on the implementation of the program no later 12 than November 1, 2021. 13

SECTION 7. CASH TRANSFER. Of the amount appropriated in Section 1 of this act from the Cooperative Welfare (General) Fund, there is hereby appropriated and the Office of the State Controller shall transfer \$640,000 from the Cooperative Welfare (General) Fund to the Rural Physician Incentive Fund on July 15, 2021, or as soon thereafter as practicable, for the Department of Health and Welfare for the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.

SECTION 8. PROJECT ECHO. Of the amount appropriated in Section 1 of this
act from the Cooperative Welfare (General) Fund for the Health Care Pol icy Initiatives Program, \$200,000 shall be distributed to the Washington,
Wyoming, Alaska, Montana, and Idaho (WWAMI) Medical Education Program for
the continued implementation of Project ECHO.

SECTION 9. HOME VISITATION PROGRAM. Of the amount appropriated in Sec-25 tion 1 of this act from the Cooperative Welfare (General) Fund, \$1,000,000 26 shall be distributed to the public health districts for the purpose of the 27 Home Visitation Program. These moneys shall not be considered general state 28 aid pursuant to Section 39-425, Idaho Code, nor shall the moneys be allocated 29 through a board of trustees formula pursuant to Section 39-411, Idaho Code. 30 The allocation of these funds is based on how much each district is currently 31 providing for comparable services from other fund sources in comparison to 32 the other health districts. Further, the public health districts may real-33 locate these moneys between districts, but only upon unanimous concurrence 34 of the Board of Directors for the public health districts. The moneys ap-35 propriated in Section 1 of this act shall be fully distributed to each public 36 health district upon enactment of this legislation as follows: 37
