

- Personnel

Professional Development



- IRI Data
 - Shifted to virtual training & pre-recorded professional development
 - More than 10 trainings with over 1000 views
- Partnership with IDLA to support transition to remote and online learning
 - 37 modules packaged as hyperdocs
 - Over 4,100 views between August and October 2020
- Top Ten Tools
 - Over 200 K-3 teachers from the lowest performing schools
 - Use IRI data and the science of reading for intervention
- Idaho Coaching Network
 - Responded to virtual and remote needs of teachers
 - Approximately 442 teachers participated or received materials

National Perspective



- Early Literacy Network
 - Fifteen State Collaborative
 - Goal to improve reading outcomes for K-3 students

• Science of Reading

- Use is required or encouraged in nineteen states
- CCSSO Playbook recommendation
- Focus of the revised Comprehensive Literacy Plan

Updated Comprehensive Literacy Plan



- Enhanced Language and Literacy Development section
 - Focus on 5 Essential Reading Components
 - Includes English Learners & Students with Specific Learning Disabilities; including Dyslexia

 Revised Essential Elements with detailed goals and next steps for all stakeholder groups
