What's working: Reading success stories from five Idaho schools



Reading scores tend to improve from fall to spring, as teachers have a full school year to work with young students.

In the fall 2018, 52.5 percent of Idaho kindergarten through third-grade students tested at grade level. By spring 2019, that number was 69.7 percent - an improvement of 17.2 percentage points.

But 13 school districts and one charter school posted improvements of more than 30 percentage points. All 14 started the school year below the state average. By spring, 12 of the 14 came in above the state average.


What gets us there...







What gets us there...





What gets us there...

- Core ELAinstruction /curriculum
- ⇒ 90-minute reading block

Tier I

- > All students
- > 70% of students proficient



What gets us there...



- Targeted intervention, based on needs
- ⇒ 30-60 minutes daily (in addition to Tier I)
- Small group instruction
- Another 15-20% proficient




What gets us there...



- Individualized supports
- > 15-30 minutes daily (in addition to Tier I & II)
- Usually 1:1
- Another 5-10%proficient



What gets us there...



The further up the triangle you go, the more individualized - and costly - the supports.





Why do we prefer it?

- Captive audience students are already at school
- Part of the teacher work day
- > Part of the calendar year
- > We already utilize full-day kindergarten
- > We already offer & encourage free Pre-K to all students





Also considered...

- > Friday school started in 2020
- > 6th-12th RtI (based on Emmett HS model) with RtI support staff
- > Considered:
 - Summer School
 - Early start / Jump start
 - After school programs

Success around Idaho


- > Fiscally sound most were running supplemental levies
- > Strong, consistent leadership in the District
- > Low teacher turnover
- > Intentionality:
 - Regularly examine data hold themselves accountable for success
 - Curriculum (no commonality, though)
 - · Building principals were instructional leaders
