STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

RS29799 / H0771

This is the FY 2023 original appropriation bill for the Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses. It appropriates a total of \$39,272,600 and caps the number of authorized full-time equivalent positions at 270.20. For benefit costs, the bill increases the appropriated amount for health insurance by \$850 to \$12,500 per eligible full time FTP, includes a one-year holiday of unemployment insurance, and adjusts workers compensation amounts. The bill also provides funding for permanent employees for the equivalent of a 3% salary structure shift and provides \$1.25 per hour per eligible employee to be distributed based on merit for change in employee compensation. The bill funds three line items, which provide additional funds for a Licensing Information System, Damage Prevention Grant, and a net-zero shift between budget programs.
