












Higher Ed's value for students

- 16.6% average annual return for students
- Higher future earnings that will continue to grow throughout their lives
- Bachelor's degree recipients earn \$816,000 more than those who do not attend college in lifetime earnings

Higher Ed's value for Idaho

- 1 out of every 14 jobs in Idaho is supported by the activities of our institutions and our students
- 11% return on investment for taxpayers
- Higher ed added \$4.5 billion to Idaho's economy in 2019-20





The Role We Play

Investing in higher ed/LC State is investing in Idaho

Who We Serve – Idaho's small college experience

- GED to graduate certificates
- Idahoans (nearly 80%)
- Low income and first generation

Where We Lead – Is where Idaho is in need

- Affordability (net price has decreased 19% in 10 years)
- Nursing (#1 Idaho, #5 national), Teacher Education, CTE
- Key initiatives: online learning, adult learners, dual credit

Connecting College to Career & Learning to Earning

- 96% academic post-graduation placement rate
- 97% CTE post-graduation placement rate
- Majority of working LC State grads stay in Idaho



The Storm We Face

National undergraduate enrollment has decreased 9% during the pandemic.*

LC State Serves

- **Idahoans.** Idaho's go-on rate dropped from 45% to 38% in 2021**
 - LC State's Idaho enrollment dropped 9% (288) from last fall
- Low income and first generation. These students are least likely to attend college and most impacted by:
 - Idaho's anti-higher education narrative ("Is college worth it?")
 - Competitive labor market ("I can make \$18 an hour right now.")
 - COVID-19 fatigue*

LC State Offers

- **Two-year programs**. Two-year enrollment is down 15% nationally*
- **CTE programs**. CTE enrollment plummets during labor shortages
 - Idaho's 2.8% unemployment rate is among best in the nation***
 Idahoans are employed, but industry still needs skilled workers!

LC State Enrollment – Bucking the trend... but struggling

- F2020 FTE +.25%, F2021 FTE -2.8%, S2022 (est. -3-4% / CTE est. -10%)
- Need your support (CEC [fully fund], line items, etc.)

The Way We're Responding

LC State continues to deliver results, focusing on Idaho's needs

NURSING: CC to BSN and RN to BSN online capacity expansion (200+), CC partnerships and staffing placement (admissions/advising specialist and nursing faculty), F2F BSN capacity expansion (20%).

CYBERSECURITY: Two Secure Operating Centers (SOC) interface with sister institutions and INL. Cybersecurity Management bachelor's via Online Idaho, available NOW!


ONLINE IDAHO: First institution fully implemented within Online Idaho. Courses up and
