



Agency Summary & Statutory Authority

The Idaho Commission on Hispanic Affairs was established by the Legislature in 1987. The commission provides various services to the Hispanic community and serves as a liaison between the community and government entities. The commission addresses issues facing Idaho's Hispanic community and focuses on five areas that include: education, health care, business & economic development, public policy, and management & performance. Statutory authority is found in Chapter 72, Title 67, Idaho Code.

Fig 1. Total Appropriation and Expenditures

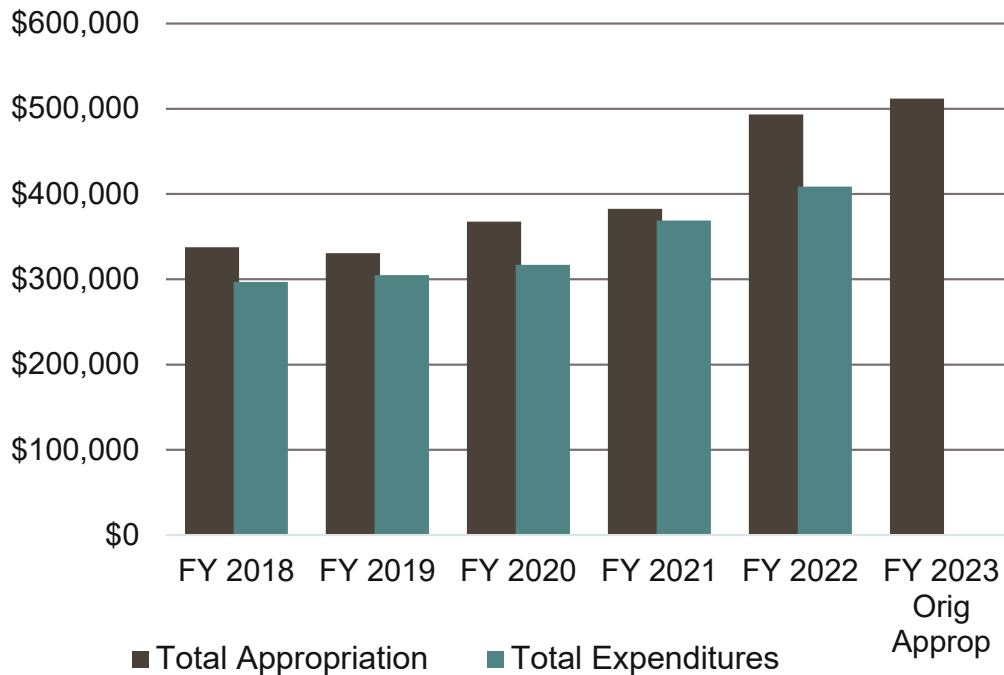
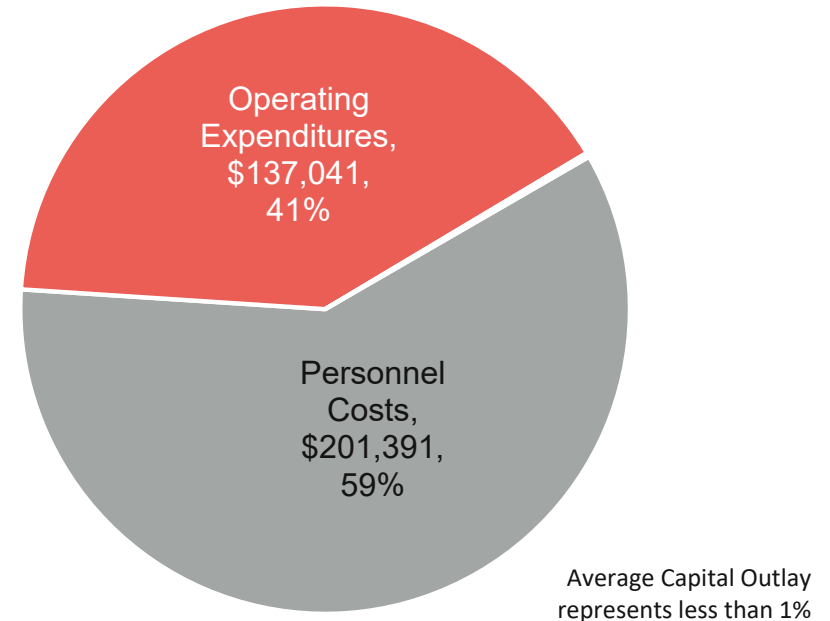


Figure 2. Average Expenditures by Expenditure Class

- The increase in appropriations beginning with FY2022 is due to a \$75,000 ongoing dedicated appropriation to use private donations to fund expenses for events hosted by the agency throughout the state. Examples of these events include the Hispanic Youth Leadership Summit, Hispanic Heritage Month celebrations, and the Hispanic Service Institute Celebration.
