S 1241 BY NICHOLS

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE IDAHO YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS ACT; AMENDING CHAPTER 3, TITLE 50, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 50-307A, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING THE IDAHO YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS ACT; AMENDING SECTION 63-3622K, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE AN EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN BUSINESSES FROM THE DUTY TO COLLECT AND REMIT SALES TAXES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
