AN ACT

1 RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS DIVISION OF  
 2 OPERATIONS; AMENDING SECTION 4, CHAPTER 170, LAWS OF 2009, TO RE-  
 3 DUCE THE APPROPRIATION FROM THE AMERICAN REINVESTMENT FUNDS  
 4 AND INCREASES THE APPROPRIATION FROM THE PUBLIC EDUCATION  
 5 STABILIZATION FUND; AMENDING SECTION 5, CHAPTER 170, LAWS OF 2009,  
 6 TO TRANSFER DEDICATED FUNDING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL INCOME  
 7 FUND; AMENDING SECTION 1, CHAPTER 272, LAWS OF 2009, APPROPRIATING  
 8 ADDITIONAL MONEYS FROM THE AMERICAN REINVESTMENT FUND AND  
 9 REDUCING THE APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND; AMEND-  
 10 ING SECTION 2, CHAPTER 272, LAWS OF 2009, TO TRANSFER DEDICATED  
 11 FUNDING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL INCOME FUND; APPROPRIATING AND  
 12 TRANSFERRING GENERAL FUND MONEYS TO THE PUBLIC EDUCATION  
 13 STABILIZATION FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010; AND DECLARING AN EMER-  
 14 GENCY.  
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16 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

17 SECTION 1. That Section 4, Chapter 170, Laws of 2009, be, and the same is hereby  
 18 amended to read as follows:

19 SECTION 4. The following amount shall be expended from state sources for the Public

33 SECTION 5. There is hereby appropriated, and the State Controller is directed to trans-  
34 fer, the sum of \$85,097,600 from the General Fund to the Public Education Stabilization Fund  
35 on July 1, 2009, or as soon as practicable.

36 SECTION 6. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to  
37 exist, Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall be in full force and effect on and after passage and  
38 approval.
