Thank you for your service to the state of Idaho and for the time that you have dedicated to shaping the energy framework in this state. I know that the current review of the Energy Plan is no simple task, and I appreciate your efforts.

I am writing to tell you that I care about Idaho's energy future. I care about using our energy wisely, knowing that every kilowatt saved through energy efficiency and conservation reduces the need for expensive new power plants and the environmental impacts they carry. I care about developing in-state renewable resources that will provide reliable energy without costly environmental regulation and public health impacts of traditional power generation. I care about holding my electric utility and its regulators accountable for the efforts they take or don't take to aggressively pursue the expansion of energy efficiency and renewable energy in Idaho.
